The 24-7 Supportive Housing Residential Counsellor functions as a member of a multi-disciplinary team to provide ongoing side-by-side in-house and community support, Activities of Daily Living teaching and stabilization for individuals living with a serious mental illness, addictions issues, dual diagnosis, and/or concurrent disorders. Working collaboratively with individuals, family members, team members, treatment team members and other service providers, the incumbent provides services within a supportive housing model, aiming for individual self-sufficiency to encourage the potential for clients to transition to a more independent living situation.

The 24-7 Supportive Housing Residential Counsellor will monitor and attend to the well-being and safety of residents and maintain a comfortable and clean-living environment.

The 24-7 Supportive Housing Residential Counsellor will work to support clients in enhancing their social/interpersonal relationships, use leisure time effectively, encourage participation in events, encourage and support the development of positive collagon biplamadriate at the development of support client treatment and recovery.
